1. MOU –ACB & MINISTRY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT

The MOU between the two institutions lays down the roles and responsibilities for each of the parties for the proper coordination, conduct and effective implementation of corruption prevention programs. All the 35 councils in the countries signed the commitment pledge.

2. ACB LAW ENFORCEMENT IN ESWATINI

The Council of Ministers of the Eastern and Southern Africa Anti-Money Laundering Group (ESAAMLG) conducted and produced a report on mutual evaluation of Malawi in combating money laundering, terrorist financing, financing of proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and other financial crimes. The 19th meeting was held at Royal Swazi Spa and Convection Centre in Ezulwini, Eswatini. from 28th august to 6th September, 2019.

The report was approved which is a clear manifestation of Government commitment. ACB was represented by the Director General, DLP Khunga, DI Mponda,, Valera Liwonde, Pacharo Nyironga, Imran Saidi and Benard Phiri,.

4. ACB REACHES OUT THROUGH RADIO

Director of Investigations was featured on Padoko program , Galaxy Fm Radio on 26th September discussing the reporting procedures in a bid to encourage the citizenry in reporting.

SPRO was on Zodiak radio on 26th September talking against corruption during a panel discussion organized by CCJP. The main gist of the discussion was on corruption in District councils.

5. DPE talks Hard to Councilors

On 19th August., DPE sensitized and talked hard against corruption to Sixty three (63) councilors from Rumphu, Mzuzu, Salima, Dedza, and Ntcheu Councils at Riverside Hotel in Lilongwe. The meeting was organized by WOLREC, a woman legal resource center which is an organization that sensitizes people on human rights issues.

6. IAD commemoration to also launch reviewed NACS

Preparations for the IAD commemoration has so far started . It is envisaged that the reviewed NACS document will be done and ready for the launch by 9th December, 2019 at Sunbird Nkopola. All sections that will send officers to the event are asked to present the names to Protocol committee, through Catherine and Patrick Mogha by 30th October, 2019.
